- A. Certified & Classified Representatives: Steve Thorpe spoke with teachers and administrators about what is happening at the schools and what they are doing to make sure the holiday season is positive for students. He reported on the fun and uplifting events that are happening throughout the district. Kids need to be celebrated right now with the holidays. Expressed appreciation with the negotiation process, it has been amazing.
- B. Student Report- No Student Representative but Ralph Brown shared about the Thanksgiving baskets and shopping for Christmas Tree program at the fire station.
- C. ESD Visit Tonja Everest: shared Core Services; Special Education, Technology Support, School Improvement, Administrative & Support. Talked about Agency Funding Sources; State Funding, major grants, fee-for-service.
- D. Superintendent Report
  - 1. Enrollment- Down 6 from the beginning of the year but still ahead of pre pandemic numbers
  - 2. Attendance November attendance CHAMPION is the High School, with an average attendance rate of 86.52%% Way to go High School!
  - 3. Physical Restraint & Seclusion Annual Report by Thad Holub
  - 4. Strategic Plan Progress Superintendent reported on all pillars ELA Adoption Update - Barbi Rigg; Finalized ELA curriculum adoption. Jr. High: Amplify, High School, Houghton Mifflin Harcourt. The district is in the process of working with both publishers to complete the order. We are currently adopting ELA 7-12 and Math K12 this year. This year was to be K-6 ELA adoption but our last adoption was done early in 2018.

Because of this we need to ask for a postponement to remain compliant. We will continue to use Journeys as our K-6 curriculum this year and adopt a new ELA K-6 during the 2023-24 **6A** school year.

Sweet Home, however, is growing. Sweet Home's elementary school enrollment is at its highest level this century and the junior high school enrollment is at its highest level since 2006. Over the next few years, Sweet Home High School is expected to see about a ten percent increase in enrollment as students in lower grades move on to high school.
